George Davis' Bio:

George grew up on the Pinellas County Gulf Beaches.

• Retired after 32 years as a fashion industry executive.

• Then started a second career as a Captain obtaining a 100-ton Master's license with a sail endorsement.

Sea Time Experiences:

- Navigator on Unlimited outboard powerboat races
- Raced Snipes and Hobie Cats
- Served on boats in Vietnam '68,'69

• Owned and sailed a 13-ton spoon-bowed coastal schooner for 18 years; cruised from Tarpon Springs to Dry Tortugas and every pass, port, creek and gunk hole in between.

• Raced on crews as navigator and tactician in PHRF (including Clearwater to Key West, and all local West Coast events), Columbus Day Regatta in Miami.

• Sailed out of Los Angeles into the Pacific

• Pursuing his affinity for traditional sail, he has been aboard the Clipper Ship Peking in NYC, the whaler Joseph Conrad in Mystic, Conn., the Nina replica locally, the Star of India clipper in San Diego and the USS Constitution in Boston.

He was on the Bounty when the Navy Captain who would sail Old Ironsides for the first time in 100 years came to learn how to sail a square-rigged ship. By the way, the new 10,000 square feet of sails for her were built locally by Doyle Sails. He served on the Volunteer Sail Training crew for 6 months in 1997. On board eventually as Mast Captain on the mizzen (aft) mast.
He lives in Clearwater with his remarkable wife Beth, in a 98-year-old house. He is 79 and

drives a 68-year-old car. Thank goodness Beth also appreciates old things.



HURRICANE IAN - SEPT. 28, 2022

On Thursday, September 29, 2022 **John Viverito** took these photos of the havoc rendered by **Hurricane "lan"** in the **Safety Harbor Marina**. The water was sucked out of the Marina & most boats were sitting in the mud.

This writer's [Ellen] 240-unit apartment complex had some damage: **4 trees went down** right behind my building and I saw the Maintenance staff climbing up to the roof on an adjacent building. My A/C unit flooded both my bathroom & my next-door neighbors.

John and Renee Viverito lost power at their home in SH although they evacuated.

Jeff & Jean Grossman in **Lee County**: We're very lucky! Even though the Eye of Hurricane "lan" went right over our home, they had no damage, not even any torn screens! **No power** though and may not have it for a while.

A 28-year-old sailboat remained trapped below piled debris at a Marina under the **Fort Myers Beach Bridge** over the weekend. Others tried to salvage their own boats further up the **Caloosahatchee River**. The storm surge pushed various vessels along downtown Fort Myers' shoreline inland, littering the landscape adjacent to U.S. Highway 41. Ten-foot chunks of floating docks were scattered among the riverside's restaurants, bars and storefronts. About 50 of the basin's residents tried to ride out the storm on their boats at the Fort Myers Yacht Basin, but were forced to abandon ship as the water levels rose and the wind gusts swirled. More than **1,000 boats** along the Caloosahatchee River were destroyed. At **Legacy Harbour Marina**, less than a mile down the river, a mound of 40-foot boats, splintered and washed onto land.

Ann Martin: near **Myrtle Beach, SC**: Had a lot of downed tree limbs and debris but her next-door neighbor has been helping her clean it up. Had 8" of rain and 60mph winds. It was kind of scary but they made it through the storm! The whole-house generator kicked on during the storm.



"Weapons of Math Destruction" ...A sort-of book report

I recently purchased a paperback non-fiction book about WMD's (**W**eapons of **M**ath **D**estruction). It is authored by Cathy O'Neil and published by Penguin Books, ISBN: 978-0-141-98541-1.

It is the story of how math algorithms (computer programs and formulas) are improperly applied. The primary story line is that these WMD's discriminate against minorities and the poor, and reward the rich. I surmised any person below "upper middle income" are also are victims of these practices. I expect that includes most of us.

I was stunned by the scope of this information. I wondered many times how I was impacted by the algorithms, feeling the answer was not good. To give you some insight as to the content, I have included a paragraph from Chapter 9:

[Auto] Insurers draw these scores from credit reports, and then, using the insurer's proprietary algorithm, create their own ratings, or e-scores. These are proxies for responsible driving. But Consumer Reports found that the e-scores, which include all sorts of demographic data, often count for more than the driver's record. In other words, how you manage money can matter more than how you drive a car. In New York State, for example, a dim in a driver's credit rating from "excellent" to merely "good" could jack up the annual cost of insurance by \$255. And in Florida, adults with clean driving records and poor credit scores paid an average of\$1,552 more than the same drivers with excellent credit and a *drunk driving conviction*.



The concept here is "charge more money where you can. It will more than offset your losses".

No matter how you rearrange the letters of BUSINESS, you can't create the word FAIR. Maybe they think it means...
