Plan to attend our Wed., JUNE 7TH SHBC meeting at 6:15 pm at the Safety Harbor Library. Our guest speaker will be GEORGE PATTON, who will give a presentation on the "MARINE DRAWBRIDGES".

George Patton, PE, MSCE is the Chief Engineer, Principal Associate, and an owner of the firm Hardesty & Hanover (H&H). H&H is a Manhattan based firm with more than 500 employees and offices throughout the United States and the United Kingdom, including Tampa, where George

works. H&H is considered the oldest engineering consulting firm in the country with a 136-year history, most known for its expertise in movable bridge engineering.







George has lived in Florida since 1971 and in Safety Harbor since 1989. He has a master's degree in structural engineering from the University of South Florida and has been designing movable bridges for more than 34 years. George conceptualized and led the design of some of Florida's iconic bascule bridges including:

- 17th Street Causeway Bridge at Port Everglades in Ft. Lauderdale,
- Circus Bridge in Venice,
- Royal Park Bridge over Lake Worth Lagoon in West Palm Beach,
- Treasure Island Causeway Bridge in St. Petersburg.
- Ocean Avenue Bridge in Lantana,
- NW 12th Avenue Bridge over the Miami River in downtown Miami,
- Matlacha Bridge in Pine Island,
- Southern Boulevard Bridge over Lake Worth Lagoon in West Palm Beach, which just completed construction,
- Jupiter Federal Bridge at Jupiter Inlet, currently under construction,
- Beckett Bridge over Whitcomb Bayou in Tarpon Springs, which just completed design with start of construction anticipated at the end of 2023,
- Venetian Causeway East Bridge in Miami Beach, currently in design.
- Dunedin Causeway Bridge, design contract just awarded.

Over his career, he has performed various engineering services on nearly every movable bridge in Florida.

The SHBC Newsletter first issue was in November 2013. If you review that issue, you will see a klunky first edition. As time went on, the style and layout was merged into what it is today. For this I am grateful, being the Editor.

I want to shout-out for Ellen Henderson's work gathering material for each month's issue. Her personality is relentless, which ensured material for publication for the last 10 years. With her help, the journey has been interesting.

Every journey must have a beginning and a destination. For me, that destination is the November 2023 issue of the Sentinel Newsletter. I cannot even remember when I took on the task of Webmaster (2006?), but that journey is also ending. It is time to turn over these tasks to younger blood. I am looking for someone to take what I have created and make it even better.

Newsletter

I use Microsoft Word as my editing software. I then use Microsoft's **Print to PDF** to create the Newsletter for distribution. If the next Editor wishes to continue with MS Word, I will provide all my methods and procedures to them, to help them come up to speed.

Website Webmaster:

There are four (4) components to this duty:

- 1 Website administration, or editing and posting web pages.
- 2 Website hosting management, or where are the web servers?
- 3. Domain name registration, or how do they find us?
- 4. Website backup, or is my machine not safe enough?

This can be a different person, but I recommend the Editor and Webmaster be the same person. This will simplify the process Newsletter development to Website posting easier. In any case, there is a lot to learn so waiting until October to start is a very bad idea. Alternatively, someone can build a new website from scratch using their own software and switch the internet pointers to the new site.

I currently use Dreamweaver to develop the website, but any software that manages HTML (web) documents can be used. The site contains HTML and ASP code. The ASP portion is relatively unchanging, so learning coding for this is not necessary. If you use Dreamweaver, just barely a basic knowledge of HTML is required. The software is a dream to use, explaining the name, and does all the technical work for you.

This may sound a bit overwhelming, but you have 4 months to get up to speed. Except for the Newsletter uploads, the website is mostly static, with occasional edits. SHBC uses emails and Newsletters as attachments to provide current activities information. A backup of the entire website is maintained on a USB hard drive (SHBC property) that is insurance against PC failure.

Just so you know:

- ➤ I am a Lifetime Member, so I am not dropping out of SHBC.
- ➤ Effective November 1st, I am a technology ghost.
- > Ten years is longer than any other job I had.

This is my story and I am sticking to it!



Mandatory Engine Kill Switch

You may have heard boats are now required to have, or be retrofitted with, mandatory kill switches tethered to the boat operator. After a little digging, I found enough detail to make mostly sense of it. Strangely enough, there was no mention of sailboats in any of the material I found. Can you imagine being tethered in a non-high performance coastal sailing sailboat?

Q6. What boats need to have an Engine Cut-Off Switch installed?

A6. Boats less than 26 feet in length that generate more than 115lbs of static thrust (~ 2-3hp) and were built beginning in January 2020. If the boats' primary helm is inside an enclosed cabin it is not required to have an Engine Cut-Off Switch.

In other words, this is a non-issue for us. It is a government regulation that applies to manufacturers.

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Material may be slightly corrected for grammatical or spelling errors, but generally left as-is unless you request otherwise. Ideally, a Microsoft WORD document would be easiest to process, but we can work with text, HTML, most word processors, or Google e-mails. Videos <u>cannot</u> be converted to be used in the Newsletter, but are okay if there is a video link provided and the end destination is the Club website. PDF files can now be converted, but the results are iffy. Text and image messaging to my cell phone, not so much. If you wish to submit your story or report in another word processor or document format, contact the S.H.B.C. Webmaster / Newsletter Editor (me) for discussing.

Submissions must be complete with text and images. If received after the 24th of the month, they will be held over for publication and not included in this current issue.

Images / photographs: If using a cell phone to take the picture, please hold the phone in the horizontal (Iandscape) position. Otherwise, they are rotated 90 degrees at my end. Unless of course it was your intent to put them in sideways, then please let me know.
