Luckily, we dodged a bullet, the hurricane was far enough West of the Suncoast to only give us some light rain, medium winds and overcast skies.

Dale Cuddeback and others reported that all of the boats in the SH MARINA fared well, even though Tampa Bay's waters did come up at high time and flooded the Marina parking enough, that the police blocked off the street. The end of hurricane season can't come too soon.



It's snowing in Munising as I write this. I lived through decades of October snows. I'm happy to be in Florida in Octobers for many years now.



It had been 50 years since I swam in Lake Superior. Munising is on the South shore of Gitche Gumi, the Great Water in Ojibwa. I traveled to visit friends (who are snowbirds, by the way.) Yes, the lake was cold, but the shallow water near the warm, sandy beach was tolerable. I even jumped off a cliff into the clear, fresh water. I had forgotten how refreshing

Boating on the lake at the base of the famed Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore was amazing. The water is clear enough to see 20 feet down and the colors change with the depth: turquoise, azure, royal; like the ocean water in the Keys and Caribbean. The lake was calm and winds light, so the day on the water was perfect. The air temp was 82 degrees.

The striation of the sandstone cliffs of Pictured Rocks gives the name to the area. The colored vista stretches for 15 miles and the cliffs are 200 feet high in some areas. The lake laps at the sandstone sculpting interesting caves and coves. On one beach I stepped into the water off the sand onto plates of sandstone, firm underfoot and beautiful because they too were striped.

# THE RACE OF THE ROCK STAR & THE THREE MARKS-FINALLY- SAT., 9/22/18

On Sat., Sept. 22 two SHBC sailboats committed to sail this race. Each one gathered up their turned-out crew, normal participant, "Incentive's" owner Dale C. had Jack Myers and guest student Alex Rothaug, our Rock Star who raced on a Tripp 26' Spinnaker boat off Long Island. It seems Ron P. had recruited him from the SH Kids Sailing Program. "Pegasus" was filled with Race Chair/owner John V., plus crew Emily Wagner and Ellen H. Since the wind was coming from the North, then veered to the N N/E then back to the North, at a range of 10-13 kts, John V. set the course for a windward N/W start, with a button hook turn around the starboard mark, then off Eastward toward the Orange mark. Followed by a S/E heading to the newly replaced\* White Mark (constructed by SH MEMBER, Chris Garrill), down by the Lollypop trees East of the small Courtney Campbell Causeway bridge, then finally N-N/W to the S/F Line with all marks to starboard.

We on **"Pegasus"** observed that at the start of the race, it would be an outgoing tide, then back to an incoming tide scenario. So it was prudent to stay on the west end of the start line during the 5-min. countdown, as the current would otherwise be pushing us into the start line's starboard mark. The two boats gathered on opposite sides of the start line. **"Pegasus"** was heading N/W doing several turns, so we wouldn't be over early, while **"Incentive"** came down from the North side.



After the start, "Pegasus" went a bit N before tacking around the starboard pin, so we wouldn't be pushed into the mark. We were very busy, so we couldn't see "Incentive". All of a sudden, they were ahead of us??? (This was a talking point during the post-race party.) About 15 minutes into the race, "Pegasus" caught up with "Incentive" and passed them. Meanwhile, Dick Greenhalgh was out for a cruise and he decide to buzz the racers. We hoped Dale would lose his attention with all of the comments coming from Dick's boat. However, "Incentive" stayed on track for the rum line toward the Orange Mark, while we on "Pegasus" had ended up N. looking at what turned out to be something on shore, taking us above the rum line. Meanwhile, "Pegasus" now on starboard tack, started exchanging tacks

with "Incentive". The wind which had been up to 12-13 kts, with the beginnings of white caps,

was now down to 8-10 kts. "Incentive" passed "Pegasus" just before the mark and was first around it, followed 3 min. later by "Pegasus".

During the 2nd leg "Pegasus" passed "Incentive" during what was a port broad reach, then a wing-on-wing battle "royal". "Incentive" finally did pull ahead of "Pegasus" before rounding the new White Mark, just 1 min. ahead of "Pegasus". "Pegasus" immediately passed "Incentive", but 3 min. later "Incentive" reversed the order and scooted on ahead. We only saw their stern after that. "Incentive "finished 1 min. 32 sec. ahead of us and they clearly won, as we owed them time and should have been ahead of them. Their secret sauce, Alex brought them really good luck.

Thanks are extended to our **SHBC Co-Race Chairs John** and **Dale** for taking the time to place the new **White Mark** in its current position, enabling we races more options out on the race course. Hopefully it will remain there for some time.

**Dale** hosted the post-race party aboard **"Incentive"**. We were fortunate to get in the race and party, as it did rain later in the day, since we're in this seemingly never-ending Summer pattern.




We recently heard from SHBC Member, **Jack Youra**, who will be in the Phillipines for a few months. He's leaving this month for Dubia, and then Capetown SA.


