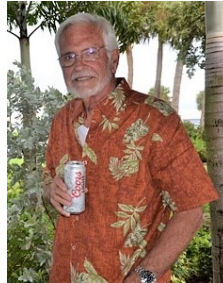

Jill did ask that I confirm her email address is still in our distribution list. She enjoys reading the Newsletter.

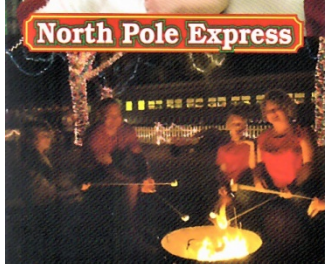
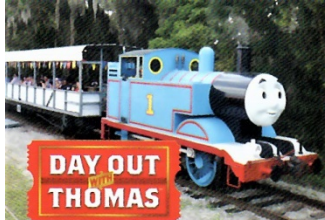

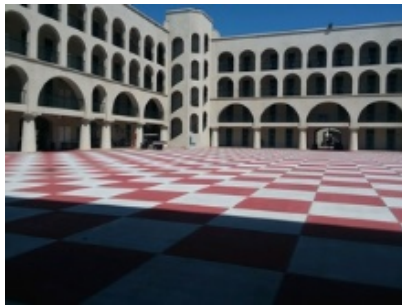

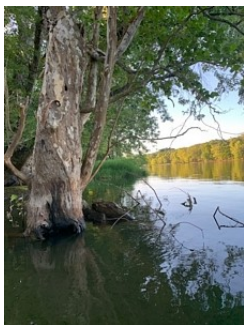
